

Pumpkin Stew Recipe- Fun Fall Recipe!



- 1 lb stew meat cut in 1 in. cubes
- 3 TBSP oil
- 1 Cup water
- 3 Lg. Potatoes-cubed
- 4 Med. Carrots-cut
- 4 Garlic Cloves
- 1 Onion, chopped
- 2 tsp. Salt
- ½ tsp. Pepper
- 2 Tbsp instant beef bouillon
- 2 cans stewed tomatoes
- Garlic salt and powder
- 1 Medium Pumpkin
- -Brown meat in oil and add water, potatoes, carrots, garlic, onion, and seasonings. Cover and simmer for 2 hours. Stir in bouillon and tomatoes.
- -Wash Pumpkin and cut stem. Empty inside, dry pumpkin and rub with olive oil.
- -Fill pumpkin with stew, place in 9x13 pan, bake in 325 degree oven until pumpkin is tender
- -Serve in bowls, the pumpkin gets soft on the inside so use a spoon to scrape the sides as you dish up
